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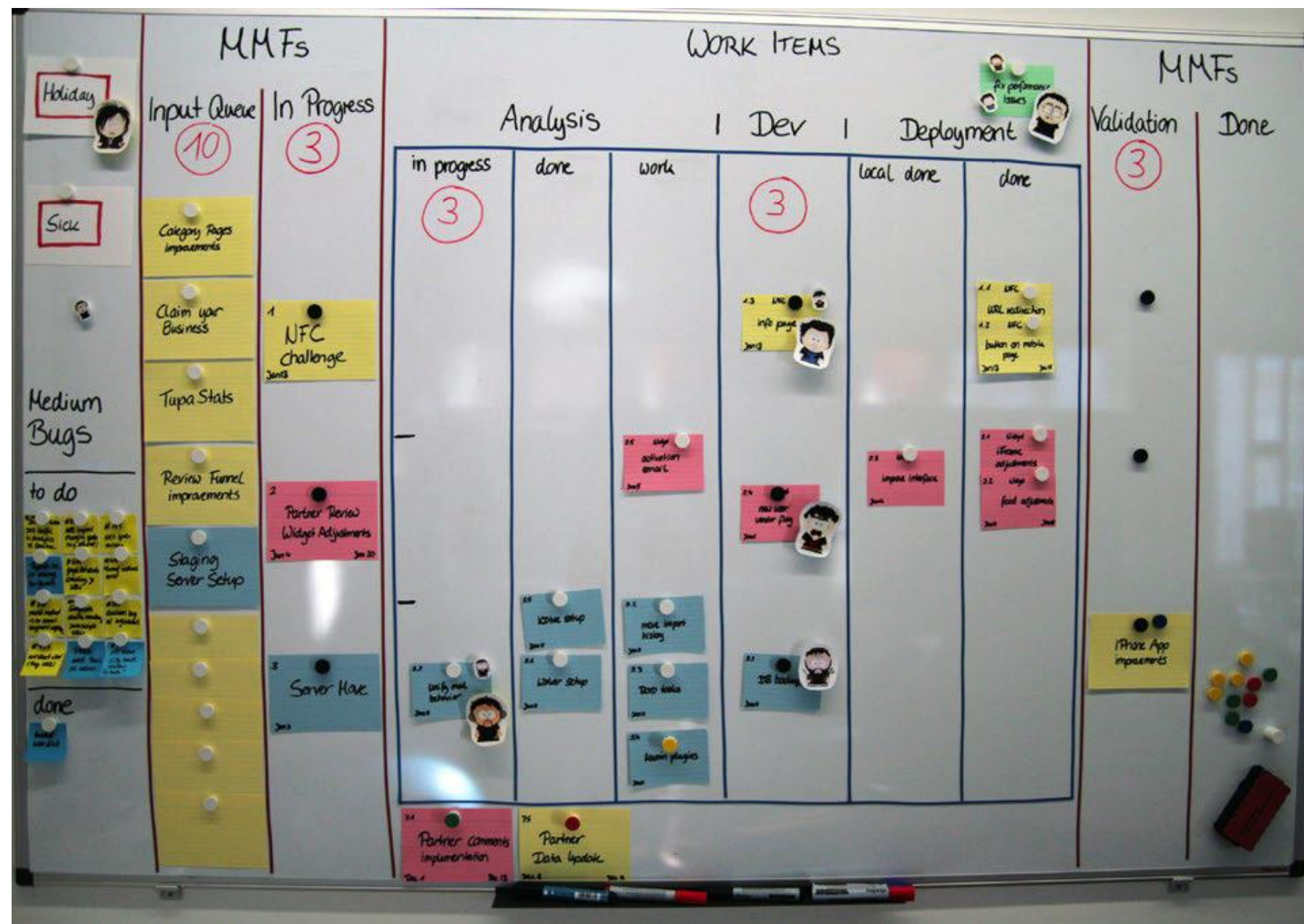

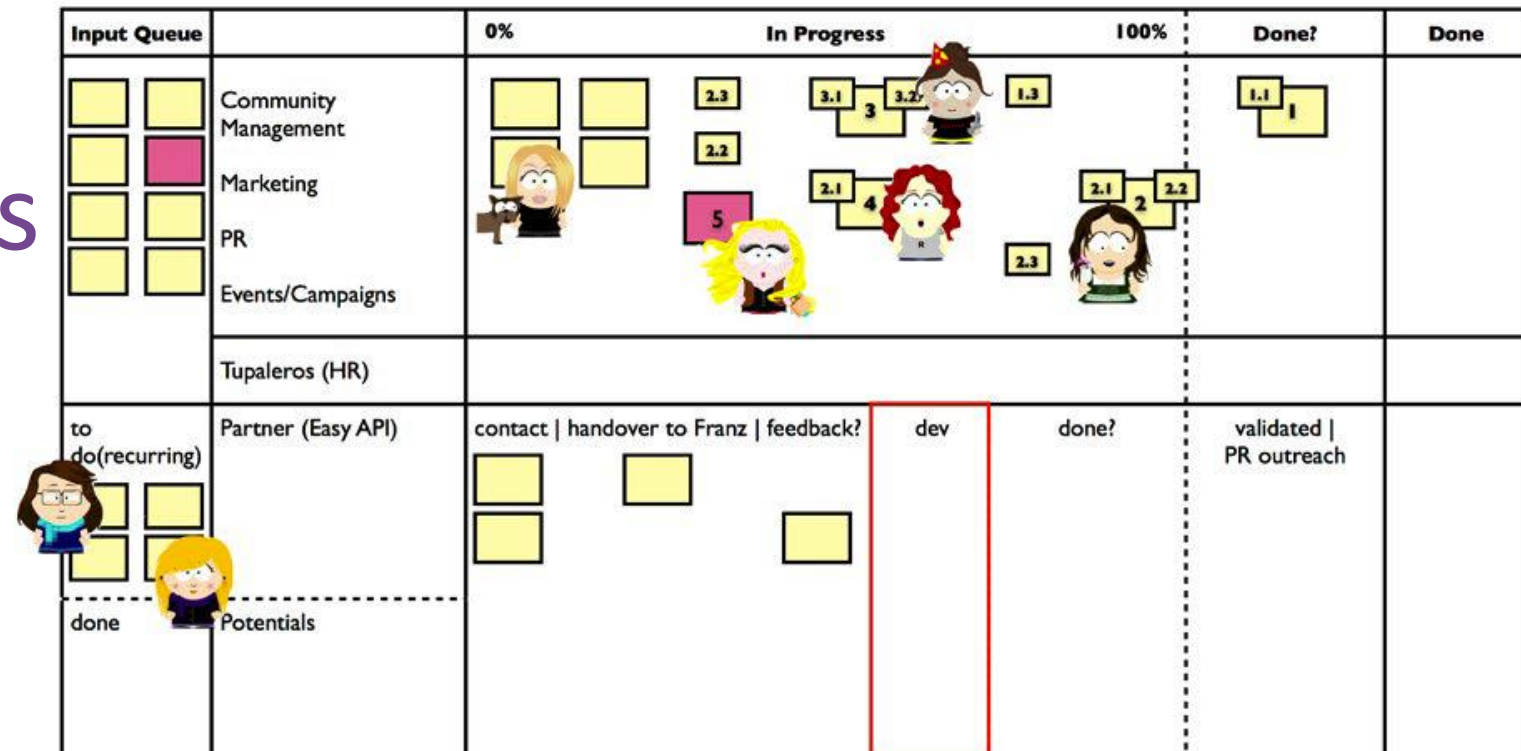


Classes of Service

yellow = worked on by external party



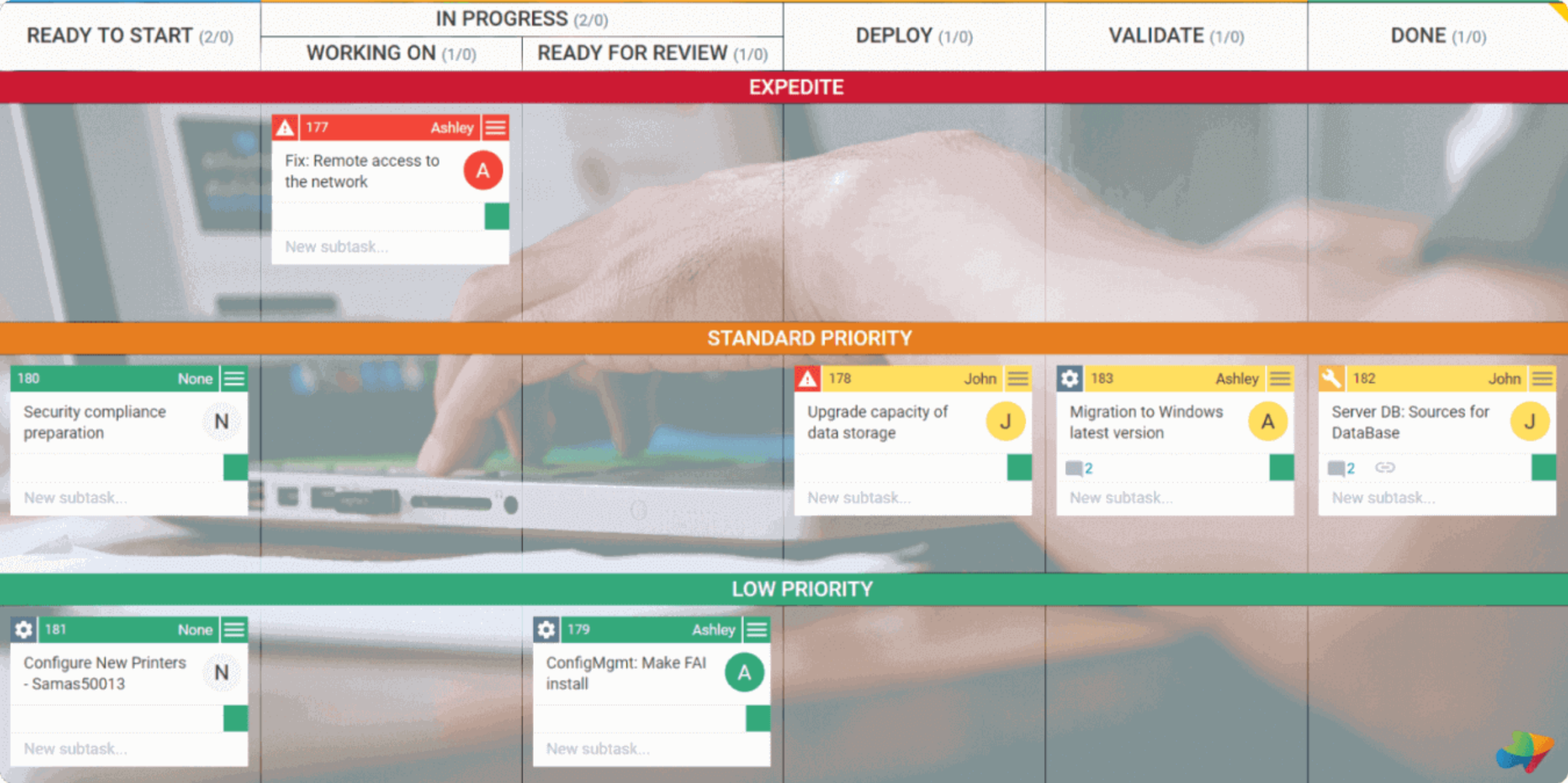

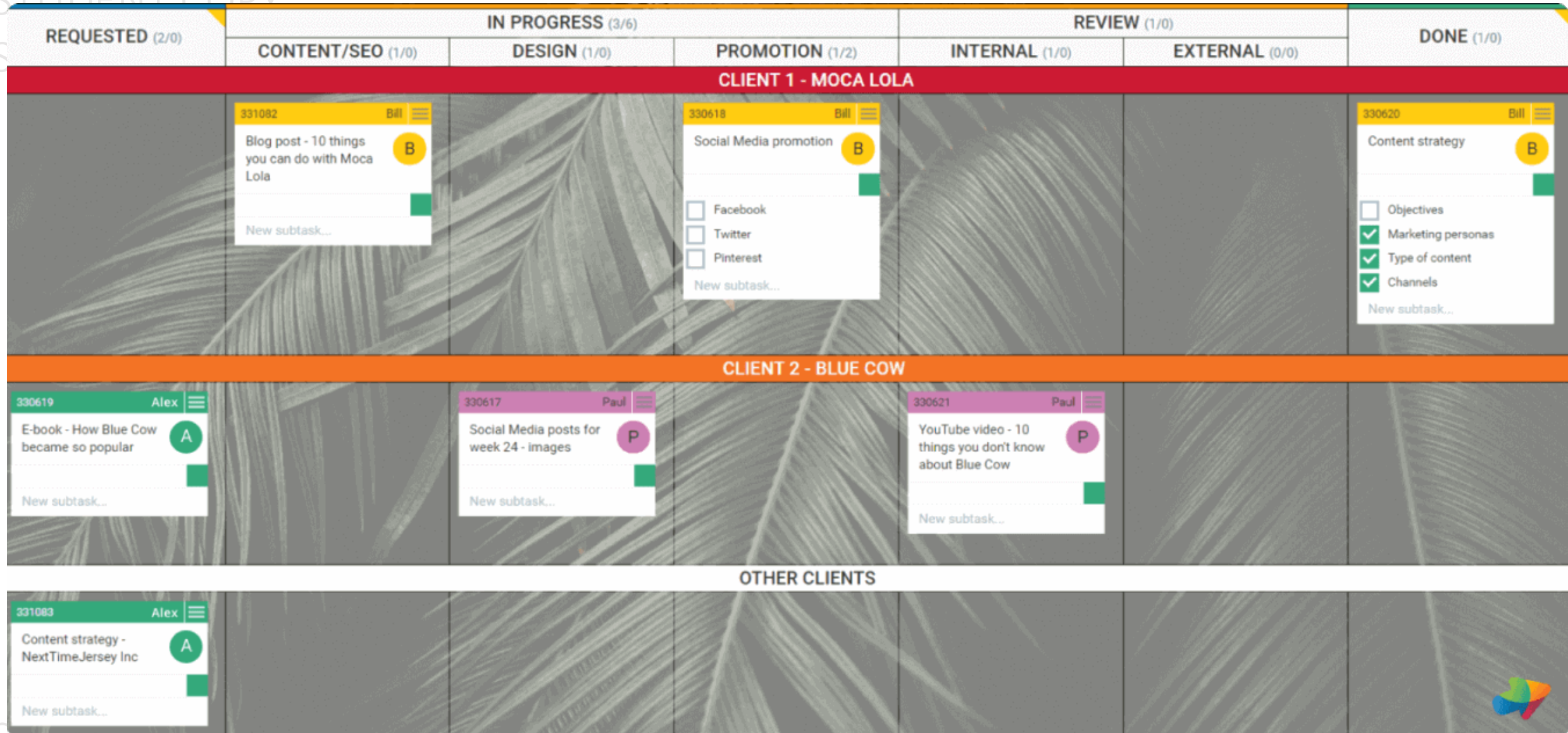
